# HEROIC CHAPLAIN

Amid the smoke of battle at Jonesboro, Georgia, August 31, 1864, Father Emmeran Bliemel, O.S.B., kneels to pray over his dying Colonel, Wilham Grace, of the Tenth Tennessee.


The Confederates are pulling back while the Federal Artillery pursues them with rapid fire. A soldier, loading his rifle, catches a glimpse of the thirty-two year old priest as does a member of Blocomb's Battery of the 5th Company, Washington Artillery.

In an instant, a solid shot, seen on the left of the painting, will carry away the life of the Chaplain, the only Catholic priest to be killed on the battlefield while caring for his men during the Civil War.

In this limited edition from original, 300 signed prints, artist James Jany, with Historical guidance from Father Peter J. Meaney O.S.B., has portrayed the unselfish spiritual love for his fellowman of the heroic Chaplain.
